



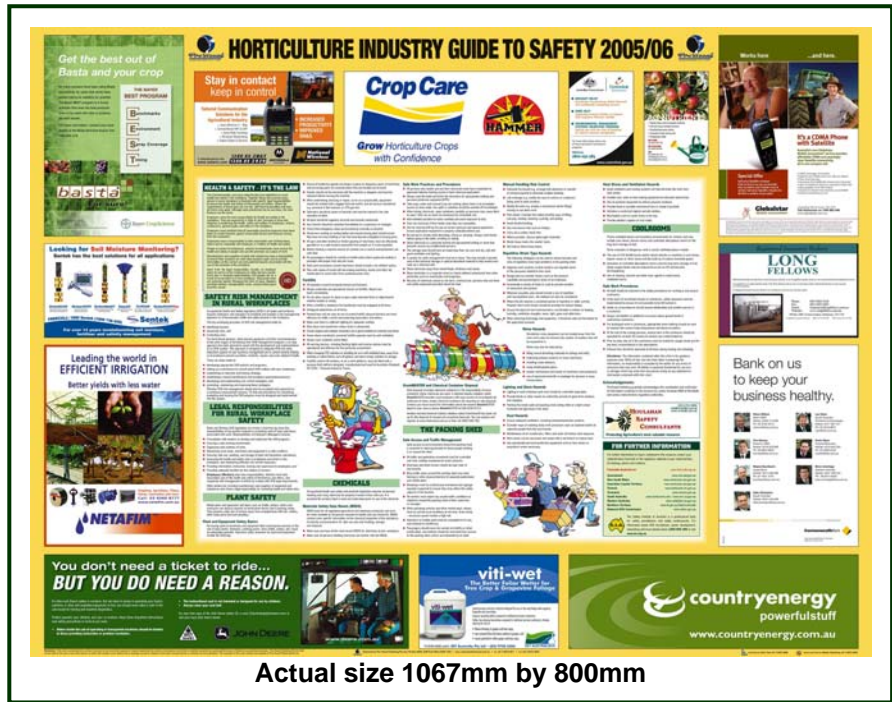
# Horticulture Industry Guide to Safety 2005/06
